## A Discussion of Alcohol Abuse and Risk Management on the MIT Campus Today

The **MIT Club of Boston** and the **Association of Independent Living Groups** (AILG) are co-sponsoring three similar sessions, each at a different Greater Boston location:

The goal of each of these sessions is to provide interested alums an opportunity to become informed about the campus situation today and maybe even to help out. FSILG (Fraternity, Sorority, and Independent Living Group) alums are especially encouraged to visit. Last fall these sessions debuted with very good attendance and rich discussion. So they are being offered again, under the same sponsorship.

The featured speaker is Danny Trujillo, Associate Dean for Community Development & Substance Abuse Programs. In his three years at MIT, Danny has worked with many people at MIT to craft a program addressing alcohol and substance abuse. The results are encouraging and MIT has received a national award as one of a few leading "innovative and empirically validated programs that effectively address alcohol and other drug issues among college student populations".

During this discussion, Danny and current student leaders will describe the situation nationally and on the MIT campus today, how MIT's Screening and Brief Intervention program works, and how it is helping. They will answer questions and explore related issues with you. One direct outgrowth of last fall's sessions was the creation of the Alumni Risk Management Advisor program. Since then eight FSILG chapters have signed on, and more are welcome. (A two hour training session is planned for November). Some dormitory alums are also discussing a similar program for these communities. Whether you are interested in making this commitment or just learning about the situation on campus today, you are welcome.

The events are free but please RSVP so enough light refreshments can be ordered. For the Yangtze Restaurant event in Lexington, people can buy their own dinner.
